From the Pastor's Desk:

In July we often turn to thoughts of independence. There are many things to celebrate about being independent including the ability to make decisions and do things for yourself, and freedom from control from outside forces. On July 4, the United States celebrates when our country was no longer governed by the whims of a far-off ruler but could make its own path forward in independence. As Christians, we celebrate the freedom from dependence on sin that is given to us in Christ, allowing us to take a path forward in love.

As I celebrate independence, however, I can't help but also think about dependence and interdependence. While dependence to the wrong forces is clearly dangerous, dependence on God actually gives us greater freedom. With dependence on God, the world doesn't rest solely on our shoulders and our limited abilities. We aren't left to deal alone with the mistakes our independent choices have led us into. We are freed to live again, finding in our dependence our independence.

Interdependence recognizes that we are tied together in mutual care. When Christ ascended after Easter he promised that the Spirit would come to tie us together into a body that we have

Yet in being willing to take the risk of being brought together into one body, we also find love and care. Our mutual relationship is stronger than any of our separate independent parts. In supporting and lifting each other up in interdependence, we find we have the freedom to do so much more than we could do alone.

So let us forge forward, independent, dependent, and interdependent all at the same time. May we be supports for each other, and may God guide us always, so that we can confidently make decisions to step out and live boldly in freedom.

Lena United Methodist Church - Finance Committee Minutes -May 31, 2022

Finance Chair, Kim Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and Pastor Keri led us in prayer. Attendees: Scott Stich, Roberta Rogers, Kim Nelson, Larry Nelson, Richard Holmes, Pastor Keri, Randy Kryder and Chris Bartelt.

Larry made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 8th meeting. Richard seconded the motion and everyone voted to approve the minutes.

Kim reviewed the Net Income/Loss Report stating that year-to-date income through April was \$13,895.37 short. The general fund checking account April-end-of-the-month balance is \$41,655.93, but would not be as good if we had not received SBA payments in 2020 and 2021 and the 941 refund in 2021. (Total of those amounts is: \$38,192.56)

Kim reviewed the Balance Sheet, March and April P&Ls and April YTD P&L. Highlights follow:

Balance Sheet as of April 30, 2022: At the end of April the balance in the General Fund is \$41,655.93. The designated fund balance is \$64,404.05. The designated account balance is higher right now due to Parking lot donations. The Nudd CD came due in May and was moved to the Nudd checking account.

P&L Reviews

March Profit & Loss comments: March income was a little low and the church gas bill was higher than budgeted. Net ordinary income was -\$1,990.54

April Profit & Loss: April was Easter month and income was not as low as March. Income for April was \$924 below budgeted amount. In the Mission accounts the \$100 Food Pantry rent payment for April was paid in May instead. Again, the church gas was over budget for the month – actual \$764 versus budgeted amount of \$455. The church insurance was paid in April. Net ordinary income for the month was -\$3,949.10.

April 30, 2022 Year to Date Profit & Loss: Income was \$40,159 against a budgeted amount of \$51,174.25 (-\$11,015.25). Comments: Trustee expenses were over budget by \$1,795.88. Net ordinary income year to date is -\$13,895.37

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 pm. Next meeting: July 12, 2022 @ 6:30 pm.

Randy Kryder, Ad Council chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Attendees: Kim Nelson, Roberta Rogers, Richard Holmes, Lynne Howe, Pastor Keri, and Chris Bartelt. Other attendees: Larry Nelson.

The minutes from the March 8 meeting were reviewed and approved as printed.

Committee Reports: **Membership** — Pastor Keri reported Jeff and Judy are not officially chairs of this committee any longer, but still handled the Mothers and Father's Day and Graduation gifts and gathered info on graduates.

Trustees – Trustees met on May 9 and elected officers. Tuck pointing work started on May 31. Lift rental from Monroe will be over \$1200 instead of \$1000. Approximate cost of tuck pointing is \$4000 + the amount for the rental of the lift. Helm will do the parking lot re-surfacing in June as they have a total of 6 jobs in Lena at the same time. \$2,428 of the \$5500 Meeker memorial money was used to purchase a new computer and 3 wireless mics. Midwest Computer Projects met with Dean and Richard on possible use of more of the Meeker memorial money, but we haven't heard back from them yet. The bus's catalytic converter was stolen. The insurance covered the cost to replace the converter minus the \$500 deductible. Trustees will look into security cameras and also re-visit possible uses for the bus. Bruce Wuebben fertilized the church lawn for free labor plus the cost of the fertilizer. Lisa and Junior Dascher have a new church sign for Highway 73 south of Lena and Richard will check with them about getting it put up

SPRC - Lynne reported Pastor Keri's ministerial review was submitted to the conference on May 24.

Lay Leader's Report, Worship Committee, Missions: - No report

Finance – Finance reports were covered at the Finance Meeting earlier tonight. Kim said a meeting was held with the congregation March 27 after church worship service to discuss the parking lot project. The project was approved by the majority in attendance. Minutes of that meeting are filed in the Ad Council book. The LUMC Designated, Memorial, Endowment ADHOC met on March 17. Minutes from this meeting are filed in the Ad Council book. Kim then reviewed the Designated Funds Policy and Procedures with the council and will make changes as discussed. Plan for use of excess funds in memorial accounts in a timely manner rests with Ad Council. She also reviewed the memorial form and will make changes to that form as discussed and will add an endowment section to the form. From the minutes of the ADHOC four designated accounts were identified by the ADHOC for no activity for 5 years. 3108 – Leadership Training: It was discussed and decided that this money could be used for lay person(s) expenses to Annual Conference. 3110 - Outreach Funds: \$224.29. It was discussed and decided this money could be used for Mother's and Father's Day gifts. 3116 - Youth Mission Trip: It was discussed and decided that we would contact Tom and Tammy Edler, Chloe, Mikaela, Raylan and Morgan and ask what mission they would like to give this money to. 3127 - Food n Fun: It was discussed and decided that this account would be re-named "M&M group" and that the group that meets every 2nd and 4th Monday morning at the church can use those funds. Other items: Discussion followed on disbursement of designated funds for Christmas and Easter. Funds will be sent to Lena Winslow Ministerial Association for \$7000 from the Christmas collection. The Easter donations of \$2585 will be sent to UMCOR for Ukraine relief.

Education — Kid's Night Out is the only youth activity right now, and it's more of an outreach activity and not Christian education. There is no Sunday School youth activity happening right now, however, Lynne mails a packet out each month to each child who would be in the Sunday School program. Feedback on the packets has been favorable.

Pastor's report: - Annual conference is June 8–10 in person at the Renaissance Conference Center in Schaumburg. Pastor Keri and Scott Stich will attend. Pastor Keri will be ordained on June 10.

Discussion was held on the possible restructure of the Methodist church and the impact it would have on the Lena United Methodist Church. The direction of the church is uncertain due to the continuing struggle over the anticipated split.
