### **From the Pastor's Desk:**

I write this nearing the end of May in the ten days between Ascension Day (when we remember that Jesus ascended to heaven after his Resurrection) and Pentecost Day (when we remember that the Holy Spirit was poured out on us). In Luke's telling of these times the disciples were told to "wait." How hard that is to do! In June we enter the time of the church year known as "ordinary time." How we long for things to be ordinary (although the time is so called because it is numbered rather than because it is "normal") We are currently stuck in the "wait" time. Shelter-in-place restrictions are slowly being lifted. For some, the lifting is coming way too slowly and they are ready to get right back to life as "normal." For others, the lifting is going way too fast as they see that "normal" is also highly infectious.

What is "normal" for us as Christians who have the Holy Spirit poured upon us? Perhaps it is that we can live in times of uncertainty with flexibility and creativity because we have a power that is beyond our own. We may not be able to use the standard tools we are familiar with, but the Holy Spirit is highly creative and equips us, the church, with what we need to continue spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. We may have to wait to see where and how the Spirit leads us, but we know we will be led. So we actively wait, eagerly looking forward to being equipped, empowered, and sent.

***Lena United Methodist Church - Finance Committee Minutes –May 12, 2020***

Finance Chair, Kim Nelson called the Zoom meeting to order at 6:35 pm. Attendees: Cathy Rich, Larry Nelson, Richard and Eleanor Holmes, Scott Stich, Randy Kryder, Jeff and Judy Baer, Pastor Keri and Chris Bartelt. Richard made a motion to approve the March 10, 2020 meeting minutes and it was seconded by Randy. Motion carried and minutes were approved.

**Balance Sheet as of April 30, 2020:** At end of April the balance in the General fund is \$12,634.32 and the balance in the Designated fund is \$22,946.62. Notes: Easter collection through April is \$2651 with approximately \$200 additional in May. Therefore, approximately \$1400 will be disbursed to each: Le-Win Food Pantry and Lena Ministerial Association Benevolence Fund. Mustard Seed is a minus as coins are not coming in presently.

**P&L Reviews-March Profit & Loss:** March income was a little short. We were budgeted to receive \$14,130 income and received \$9,005. Income to expenses was -\$689. This is very good. We had budgeted for three payrolls in March, but that doesn't happen until May. Gas and Electric bills are very well managed.

**April Profit & Loss:** Income to expense was -\$1,716.61. We paid conference insurance bill of \$2,406.75. \$100 to Food Pantry not paid in April. We will send with May payment. Income is holding its own License plates are off bus, and not using bus due to pandemic. Chris will watch for rebate on bus insurance.

**January through April Year to Date Profit & Loss:** Total expenses to budget doing well. Telephone bill is higher than last year. Last year was \$206 per month, this year is \$256 per month. Trustees may want to check on this. Gas and electric expenses doing excellent. Parsonage expenses are going up due to increased internet charge due to shelter at home to add extra data to Pastor Keri's cell phone (was \$70 per month, now \$90 per month). The church internet account now has a monthly Zoom charge of less than \$15.

We are paying Payroll as we were before shelter in place.

Kim brought up the SBA loan info through the CARES act. The second round of loans for small business payroll protection is available until June 30. (We did not apply during the first round and the available funds were disbursed very fast.) Churches can apply as non-profits. We are going to apply for an \$18,000 free loan. We need to select a signer and contact person. Randy made a motion to nominate Richard Holmes as Chairman of Trustees as the signer. Kim seconded the motion and all were in favor. Motion passed and carried. Our bank president will meet with Kim, Richard and Pastor Keri at 10 am on Wednesday, May 13 to pick up the loan paperwork and he will submit the loan application on-line. If we are successful in receiving the loan, the money will be used for payroll for the next few months.

May 12, 2020***

Randy Kryder, Ad Council chairman, called the Zoom meeting to order at 7 pm. Other members present were: Cathy Rich, Richard and Eleanor Holmes, Scott Stich, Jeff and Judy Baer, Kim Nelson, Pastor Keri and Chris Bartelt. Other attendees: Larry Nelson.

Special prayer requests were for a MAF pilot in Indonesia who's plane crashed in a lake and she died, Rhys Stone having an endoscope procedure done next week in Cincinnati, Tom Mau having bypass surgery on May 18. Judy Baer said her sister still has double pneumonia, niece still needs a medical test and her friend Doris Larch has been in the hospital three weeks. Jeff Baer said his golf partner, Lee Freedlund needs stents.

The minutes from the March 10, 2020 meeting were accepted as printed. The minutes from the March 19 meeting were accepted with the correction that Judy Baer was an attendee.

**Committee Reports: Membership** – Judy Baer reported we have not received the Bibles for graduates yet as the shipping warehouse is closed due to the coronavirus. A date to present Mothers and Fathers day gifts and to recognize graduates is on hold for now as we do not know when graduation will be held.

**Trustees** – Trustees had a Zoom meeting on Monday, May 11 and 8 of the 9 committee members were present. Richard said he shut down the boiler today. Loescher is coming at 7:30 am on May 13 to inspect chimney liner. Loose bricks need to be repaired. Squirrels are along the outside of the elevator, into the eaves and attic. A box cover was made to go over the air conditioner copper pipes and the squirrels chewed through that. The trustees voted to repair the area with a heavier aluminum box to cover the piping. The parsonage deck and stairs needs to be power washed and stained. This was last done in 2017. G&H Painting can do it for \$450-\$475. The bus license plates have been removed and stored and the key is stored during this time of Covid-19 as the bus is not being used. This will provide a savings on insurance costs.

**SPRC** – Pastor Keri reported that SPRC is continuing to pay Staff for all hours during this time of pandemic and SPRC has met periodically during this time of pandemic on this topic. Ministry reviews (pastor's reviews) through the Northern Illinois Conference have been delayed

**Finance** – Finance reports were covered at the Finance Meeting earlier tonight. Kim brought up the Small Business Paycheck Protection Program loan info through the CARES act that she presented at the Finance meeting. Kristi Patterson from Good Shepherd and Jess Smith from Beloved are doing most of the planning. Beloved will do the Bible stories and Stacey Mader has said she will do the meals.

**Missions:** No report. Missions committee has not reconvened.

**Worship** – No report.

**Youth Director's Report:** Pastor Roger did not attend. Pastor Keri reported that all fundraising cookouts at AJ's Lena Maid Meats for this summer have been cancelled (this includes fundraisers for Youth, Men and Women). Pastor Keri reported to the Council that Pastor Roger Bronkema will resign his position as LUMC Youth Director effective July 1 as he has been appointed as Pastor for Elizabeth UMC in addition to Warren UMC.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Keri said we are on a holding pattern and she doesn't know when in-person services will begin again. The challenge is how to be church without gathering. She has been checking in with people over the phone. We are getting a different crowd for the on-line service versus in-person worship. Our Bishop is listening to health experts and state authorities and is not in favor of moving forward with opening without their recommendations. Singing in a worship service setting is a way of spread the virus. Outdoor services may be a possibility for the summer. Harmony UMC in Freeport has a drive-thru service. We may be able to try something like that. The Bishop and cabinet are requiring clergy to take a 3-day sabbath and in order to do this, they have formulated a video to be used for worship service. This worship video will be shown at LUMC on May 24.

Randy said we need to approve moving forward with staining the parsonage deck and steps. Judy made a motion for power washing and staining the deck at a cost of \$450-\$475 by G&H Painting. Richard seconded the motion. Everyone approved. Motion passed and carried. Richard will contact G&H Painting to schedule.

A. We've served for 12 years and our time has come to go back to America. We have many reasons to stay, and many reasons to go. In the end, we feel it is the right thing to move back to our passport country. Thank you for praying for us during the more recent difficult years.

Q. Who won the award for the most promising band student, most promising english student, honor roll, and national honor society?

A. That would be our incredibly talented Elise. She will be a Junior next year. She is also nervous about going to a new school, but our preview trip last October has given her renewed confidence for the challenge ahead.

Q. Did you know the pilot that died last week?

A. Yes. Zach spoke with her on a Zoom meeting the night before she died. We did not know her well, but we shared a lot of common interests. Mandy helped with the autopsy arrangements and Zach gave technical advice to the staff in charge of her funeral which was broadcast live to viewers all over the world. Q. Where will Izzy go to school this fall?

A. Isabelle was awarded the honor of "Student of the Year" during high school awards night. She is definitely ready for college! Izzy is planning to attend LeTourneau University in Longview, TX (just like her dad)! How awesome is that! Q. Will you get a refund for your tickets?

A. The flight from SE Asia to England is not possible because our airport closed back in April. Our travel agent is still attempting to get us a refund. British Airways is reluctant to issue a refund because their leg of the trip is still active even though all travel in our country has been banned.

Q. When are you leaving?

A. We are waiting for the airport to open again. We expect it will open in a few weeks. As soon as it opens, we plan to purchase new tickets, but not a moment before. We're not going to get stuck with unusable tickets again. Please pray for this situation.

Q. Will you continue to work for Wycliffe when you return to the United States?

A. Yes. We will have our normal home assignment duties. In addition, the school in SE Asia was so impressed with Zach's assistance running school online that they have asked Zach to consider consulting for them remotely.

Q. Will Wycliffe continue to pay you when you return to the USA?

A. Yes and No. We don't receive a salary from Wycliffe. We are 100% volunteers. So, yes, donations that are sent to Wycliffe intended for our ministry will continue to be sent to us, and no we have never gotten a regular salary from Wycliffe. That will remain the same.

Q. Should I stop sending donations once you leave the field?

A. That is your choice; however, we will still incur monthly living expenses in America. We would be most grateful if your generosity would continue through the end of 2020 so that we can finish our ministry with Wycliffe prior to finding new employment.

Q. Do you have a job in America?

A. Not yet. We will spend the next six months finishing our ministry with Wycliffe while looking for full time employment.

Q. Do you already own a house in America?

A. No. We hope to find one before high school starts in August. We want the girls to feel a sense of being home before they start a new high school. We know this is a tight timeframe, and we appreciate your prayers.

Q. Where will you live in America?

A. We plan to live in the Atlanta, GA area. Our friend leads a high school in that area. It is a unique school, and we expect it will be a healthy place for our girls to attend while learning a new culture. The location also has a number of aviation employment opportunities. There are other reasons, but these are the main reasons.

Q. Do you own a vehicle in America?

A. None, however, we do have a red tricycle in storage. God will provide something more appropriate.

Q. What do you need in America?

A. We need everything a family needs to furnish a house. It's like we are newlyweds again, except we have teenage girls and no furniture. We sold it all to go to the field. You name it, we need it. We are traveling with our suitcases, and that's it. If you want to donate things or gift certificates, please contact us.

Q. What are you doing with your stuff in SE Asia?

A. We must sell every last item. Many of the nationals do not live like we do. For example, most of our 'customers' have absolutely zero interest in purchasing a waffle maker. And we are not putting a heavy waffle maker in our suitcase! We are doing the best we can, but literally "everything must go!"

Q. Will you be visiting everyone this summer?

A. We need to focus on getting our family settled first, but we hope to be in Illinois for a few weeks, possibly in July. We will also be in Texas to drop Izzy off at college. Our plans this summer depend on the airport opening, finding a place to live, etc., etc., etc..

Q. Will the girls attend a culture transition training seminar?

A. Yes, the girls are enrolled in age appropriate seminars which are being held in Georgia. One of the leaders at the seminar is a former Wycliffe missionary and was their counselor at a previous conference. All three are looking forward to attending.

Q. Will you miss living in SE Asia?

A. Yes. Very much.

Q. Are Zach and Mandy doing OK with this transition?

A. It's hard, but we are confident that we have made the right decision. Zach could stay and fly again or help the school advance in technology. We still have an opportunity to make an impact, but it's time to go. I'm sure you've had to make tough decisions before too. It's part of life.
